## Category 1: Formative Assessments + Classwork (30%)

This grade will cover our smaller assignments as we work through a text or a project. This will also include daily classwork, our IQ logs each marking period, and grammar and vocab assignments.

## Category 2: Writing Responses (35%)

This grade will be based on the day-to-day medium-sized writing assignments in which students practice the literacy skills they have learned. Generally, these can be finished in class but may need to be completed at home occasionally.

### Category 3: Essays and Major Assignments (35%)

In these assignments, students will explore and expand upon a topic using analysis and critical thinking. These will be larger scale assignments and will demonstrate the skills and understanding that the students have worked on in that unit.

Major assignments will vary depending on the unit, but they are always the project that we are working toward in the unit. This grade includes turning in, editing, and polishing drafts throughout the process.
